Spokane – Yesterday, the Spokane Veterans Home was pleased to welcome home a Veteran who has recovered from COVID-19. Our Veteran had been transferred to the Mann-Grandstaff VA Medical Center where they received specialized care in the VA's COVID-19 Unit.

This is the fifth resident that has been welcomed home by the staff of the Spokane Veterans Home.

Residents are able to return from the Mann-Grandstaff VA Medical Center once they have 2 negative COVID-19 tests within 24 hours. The Spokane Veterans Home established a special COVID-19 Recovery Wing and residents will remain in this quarantine area for 14 days as a precaution, prior to moving back to their own room.
