Dear Spokane Veterans Home Residents, Family, Representatives, and Staff:

In an effort to maintain transparency, we are sharing new information on COVID-19 and its impact on our Home.

New information:

We are saddened to report that one of our honored Residents passed away following their diagnosis of COVID-19. We offer our sincere condolences to their Family and Friends during this very challenging time.

Over the weekend, we also received confirmation of four additional COVID-19 positive test results for residents and two additional staff. This brings the total to six positive residents and four positive staff since July 21, 2021. All residents have been transferred to local hospitals.

Previously reported information:

We are working closely with the Spokane Regional Health District and following guidance from them, Centers for Disease Control, Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), and our State Department of Health to ensure we are safeguarding our residents and staff.

All residents will be tested and we will retest every 3-5 days until 14 days have passed without a positive. Additional environmental cleaning continues to take place and the Spokane Veterans Home will conduct enhanced surveillance, including symptom and temperature checks during each shift, for residents in the affected areas for a period of at least 14 days.

In accordance with recommendations from the Spokane Regional Health District, indoor visitation will be temporarily suspended and re-evaluated after 7 days. Outdoor visitation, compassionate care visits, and volunteers are still permitted with the current guidelines in place.

Staff are wearing appropriate PPE throughout the nursing care building and we have adequate supplies of all PPE.

Staff at the Spokane Veterans Home continue to monitor whether they have any symptoms, including the presence of a fever. As part of our ongoing screening process, all staff are screened upon arrival at work each day. This process includes a series of questions around whether symptoms are present and a temperature check. Staff are asked to report any symptoms that occur after coming to work.

The State Veterans Homes are following guidance from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, which requires regular testing of all long-term care facility staff. The Spokane Veterans Home is performing weekly testing based on current guidance.

As a part of our continued efforts to curb the spread of the COVID-19 virus, the State Veterans Homes are vaccine administrators and hold scheduled vaccination clinics for unvaccinated residents, staff, and now family and visitors on-site. We encourage all residents, staff, and community members who are able and eligible to be vaccinated to consider getting vaccinated for COVID-19.
